Description

1. Target groups

Project partners, policy makers, civil society organizations, youth, local actors, European Parliamentarians and other high policy makers.

2. Description of the event and its activities/ context :

Held in Rychnov nad Kněžnou, Czechia between 11th and 13th June 2025, the GroundUp event brought together young participants, local stakeholders, and European partners to explore the evolving political and social realities affecting rural youth. The discussions focused on how conservative political shifts, disinformation, and social polarisation are influencing quality of life and democratic participation in rural Europe. One of the successes of the event was to use the formats which allowed us to actively youth from local schools, who stayed with the project group throughout the day, participated in discussions, World Cafe and the Oxford Debate.

MAIN SUCCESSES OF THE EVENT

The event gave me a better understanding of the challenges rural youth face and how conservative shifts affect them. The World Café and Oxford Debate were insightful. I gained useful ideas for community engagement and intercultural communication that. I can apply in my work.

I've learned to listen to young people. I've learned about debating skills and forming arguments. I've learned about the influencce of politics in decisions we make and how we can interact with politicians."

The dynamics of the coffee table, associated with the colors, were very interesting because we were able to exchange opinjons and experiences.

We also really enjoyed the debate with a geder perspective. especially because the young people were the protagonists.

The conference day opened with a keynote by Josef Bernard discussing "Left-behind places in Czechia and Europe: challenges and opportunities, with a focus on youth", followed by a student-led World Café on youth perspectives. In the second part of the day, Jonáš Syrovátka presented his talk "Conservative shifts – theoretical framing and the case of the Motorist Party", followed by Max Gede who offered a broader understanding of "Shifts in political spheres".

The programme featured a World Café session with local students, where participants engaged in structured small-group dialogues on challenges such as youth unemployment, depopulation, and political disengagement. These conversations created a space for listening, reflection, and collective insight into the lived experiences of rural youth.

One of the highlights of the event was the Oxford Debate on the gender dimension of politics, where young delegates presented well-researched arguments on current political dynamics across the EU. The exchange helped build critical thinking and dialogue skills among participants.

The conference also included expert inputs on the conservative wave across Europe, discussions on rural youth aspirations, and informal moments of cultural exchange such as a château tour and live music. The event fostered transnational dialogue, built mutual understanding, and contributed meaningfully to the project's mission of empowering young citizens from the ground up, as it very well shows in the feedback we have collected from the direct participants (please see below).
